

Guidelines for Applications to the Third-Year Undergraduate Program in 2021
(Selection Examination for the School of International Studies Twinning Program)

The applicant is responsible for confirming all the information (for his/her specific examination category) included in the Guidelines for Applicants.

Introduction

In accordance with the Twinning Program, the School of International Studies at Kanazawa University accepts students from our partner institutions, Ho Chi Minh City University of Social Sciences and Humanities, and the Foreign Trade University of Vietnam (Hanoi), as well as transfer students from Pukyong National University in South Korea.

The period of the Twinning Program is for four years. After education in English, Japanese and/or Liberal Arts at their home university for the first two years, students of the Twinning Program can meet the eligibility requirements for the examination that allows them to be admitted in the third year to Kanazawa University. The students who pass the examination mainly attend specialized core subjects related to international studies at Kanazawa University for two years. Those who complete the Twinning Program will be able to acquire the bachelor's degree of "Bachelor of International Studies" (Bachelor of Arts).

Within the School of International Studies, students learn about the global community and gain basic knowledge about international society and Japanese society, develop a broad understanding of international relations on the basis of the actual situations in each of the specified regions, and receive professional training necessary for acquiring practical knowledge about those particular regions. The aim of the program is to provide students with an understanding of the true essence of our globalizing society in the 21st century, to assist them in acquiring a high level of language ability (including English and Japanese) within each region useful for their international careers, and to foster talented individuals who are genuinely capable of harmonious coexistence with people from other cultures.

2. Qualifications for Application

A student who falls into all categories listed below:

- (1) An individual who is a student of Ho Chi Minh City University of Social Sciences and Humanities, Foreign Trade University (Hanoi), or Pukyong National University and is expected to earn all the necessary credits to complete the first half of the Twinning Program.
- (2) An individual who has received the recommendation of the President of a university listed above, or an individual who will receive the recommendation after being successfully selected.
- (3) An individual who has taken and successfully passed the N2 or N1 Level of the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPS) provided by Japan Educational Exchanges and Services (JEES).
- (4) An individual who has taken TOEFL – iBT (including "Special Home Edition"), TOEIC (L&R), or IELTS.
- (5) An individual who is able to come to Japan by April 1, 2021 or October 1, 2021.

3. Application Procedures

(1) Periods of Enrollment

April 2021: Pukyong National University

October 2021: Pukyong National University, Ho Chi Minh City University of Social Sciences and Humanities, Foreign Trade University (Hanoi)

(2) Application Period

(3) Documents Required for Application

Document	Note
1. Application for Admission	Required fields must be filled out by the student himself/herself in Japanese.
2. Admission Ticket for Examination	The photo (length 4cm x width 3 cm) must show the upper body from the front side, without a hat, and must be taken within 3 months prior to the application. Paste the photo in the designated section.
3. Letter of Recommendation	A letter of recommendation from the President of the student's home university (this may be submitted after successful selection).
4. Transcript	Issued by the student's home university (in the English language).
5. A copy of TOEFL-iBT, TOEIC (L&R), or IELTS score report	A photocopy of the Score Report of TOEFL-iBT (including "Special Home Edition"), TOEIC (L&R) (issued by Educational Testing Service) or the Score Report of IELTS. Note: It is limited to the score received within 2 years before the application deadline. A printed score confirmation screen from the internet is not acceptable.
6. A copy of the "Japanese-Language Proficiency Test Certificate of Result and Scores"	A photocopy of "Japanese-Language Proficiency Test Certificate of Result and Scores" with N1 or N2 level issued by Japan Educational Exchanges and Services (JEES). Note: Date of test is not considered.
7. A copy of your passport and residence card	A photocopy of the page in your passport in which your name and nationality are written. Applicants residing in Japan should also submit a copy of their Residence card (front and back).

(4) Submission of Required Documents

Check and make sure all required documents are ready, and submit them to the staff in charge at your home university during the application period.

(5) Entrance Examination Fee

The fee is waived.

(6) Admission Ticket for Examination

The Admission Ticket for the Examination will be sent by post after the receipt of application documents.

4. Procedures for Entrance Examination

The entrance examination will involve selection by documents and oral examination. Applicants must use a webcam for the oral examination so that their identity can be confirmed. Interviews are conducted online. Please set up a webcam and register a webcam account (if required) beforehand.

5. Date and Location of the Entrance Examination

The oral examination will be held by the following date, with scheduling arrangements made in advance via email between applicants and the faculty member.

October Admission	Fri., May 21, 2021

6. Announcement to Successful Applicants

April Admission	Thu., December 24, 2020
October Admission	Tue., June 29, 2021

“Notification of Selection” will be sent to successful applicants through the staff in charge at their home university.

7. Entrance Procedures

(1) Confirmation of Enrollment

Successful applicants will be issued a letter of acceptance after submitting “Confirmation of Enrollment” to the Head of School of International Studies. This form will be sent enclosed with the “Notification of Selection”.

Deadline for submitting the “Confirmation of Enrollment” is as follows.

April Admission	Tue., January 19, 2021
October Admission	Tue., July 20, 2021

Successful applicants will find out about the period and method of entrance procedures through the “Procedural Guidelines for Third-Year Undergraduate Program Admission” that

will be sent at the end of February for April admissions or at the end of August for October admissions.

Successful applicants are required to submit a bank account balance certificate (showing a balance of 1 million yen or more) so that Kanazawa University can apply for a Certificate of Eligibility (CoE) on behalf of them.

(2) Fees

The fee amount to be paid by those admitted in 2021 has not been decided yet.

(3) Insurance

Kanazawa University requires that students purchase “Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS: Gakkennsai)” and “Liability Insurance coupled with PAS (Futai Baiseiki)” in case of possible accidents during your student life. Also, if you move to a private apartment after enrolling in the university, you may need to join the International Student Housing Comprehensive Compensation program in addition to the abovementioned insurances. Please see below more information about the above-mentioned insurance policies.

I. [1] Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS: Gakkennsai).

This insurance is designed to give aid to students that have suffered bodily injury due to 1) a sudden, incidental and exogenous accident during their education/research activities at home or abroad, or 2) an accident during commuting time or in transit between school facilities.

[2] Liability Insurance coupled with PAS (Futai Baiseiki)

Students (the insured) will be covered up to the limit of payment against damages for which, during the period of this insurance, they may be held legally liable to pay in Japan or abroad for injuring a third party or damaging any property belonging to a third party, etc. during their curricular activities, school events, extracurricular activities, or commuting to and from them. All students in Kanazawa University must purchase both PAS and Liability Insurance coupled with PAS.

The Insurance fee is 1,340 JPY for one year, and it is 2,430 JPY for two years.

II. Comprehensive Renters Insurance for International Students Studying in Japan

(When you enter a dormitory of the university or a private apartment where Kanazawa University is not required to help with providing a joint guaranty regarding the international student's lease, there is no additional fee required).

This insurance is for those who would need to be compensated in a case in which one caused injury to others in the apartment to which one moved, or damaged others' property and /or caused damage to a downstairs area due to an accident such as water leakage.

The insurance fee is 4,000 JPY for one year, and it is 8,000 JPY for two years.
